Joint Tenancy Deed	A way for two or more persons to co- own real estate jointly in undivided interests	survivor(s) receive the decedent's (dead person's) portion automatically by	May not be wise to use this if your estate is subject to the Federal Estate Tax (inheritance tax) or if you have a trust
Tenants In Common	A way for two or more persons to co- own real estate jointly in undivided separate interests		Agreement detailing all the
Beneficiary Deed	A way to avoid probate court by giving one or more persons a revocable interest (i.e., you can revoke this before you die) in your real estate, which causes it to directly transfer upon your death to the person(s) you designate	automatically passes to the person you have named in the beneficiary deed	Make sure that this does not impair your ability to receive Medicaid benefits
